## City's façade committee gets updated guidelines, members

A committee to oversee a program that encourages business owners to update their buildings now has new faces and new rules to go by.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, aldermen unanimously approved appointees suggested by Mayor Bill Crusinberry. Alderman Larry Baughn, civic committee chairmen, will head up the committee. Other members are Marta Pierce, Valarie Paulson, Carol Hicks, Gail Lane and Susan Comstock.

The façade committee was established as a way of preserving the historical integrity of downtown buildings but under new guidelines proposed by Crusinberry, the historical aspect has been discontinued and the service area expanded to all businesses in Hoopeston, not just those downtown.

Other existing guidelines were also changed. Previously, the program was 50/50 but will now be up to 50/50. Projects had received funds on a first come, first served basis, but now will be decided by the committee.

In other business, the council approved fee increases for Floral Hill Cemetery. Presented by Alderwoman Nancy Stipp, cemetery committee chairman, lot prices will be: 1 grave, \$350; 2 spaces \$600; 3 spaces \$850; 4 spaces \$1,100; 5 spaces \$1,350; 6 spaces \$1,600; 7

spaces \$1,850; and 8 spaces, \$2,100.

Additional spaces over eight will have \$250 added to the price.

Baby graves in designated areas will cost \$175.

Labor fees were also increased, with grave openings to cost \$450 on weekdays, \$675 on Saturdays and \$1,125 on Sundays.

Openings for cremation urns and baby graves will cost \$230 on weekdays, \$345 on Saturdays and \$575 on Sundays.

Sunday openings are done only in emergencies and

with approval of the cemetery committee.

Disinterment fees will be \$1,350 for an adult grave and \$690 for ashes and baby graves.

The council also discussed the electric aggregation program. Homefield Energy was the winning bidder on May 15 and will provide electricity at 4.333 cents per kilowatt hour for a 22-month term. The cost is higher than was anticipated—and higher than the 4.26 cent rate provided to Vermilion County by Integrys.

Crusinberry said residents should be able to save \$10 to \$15 per month. Rebates to the city under the aggregation program will be earmarked to offset infrastructure improvement costs, he added.

Referencing a letter to the editor in Just the Facts about a customer remaining loyal to current provider Ameren, Alderman Bill Goodwine said he talked with Ameren representatives who said the company is more interested in supplying electricity than selling it.
