Rural Rossville woman hospitalized after fiery accident

A rural Rossville woman was airlifted to a Chicago area burn center after an accident at 7:35 a.m. Tuesday.

According to police reports, Wendy Gernand, 53, was driving a John Deere tractor pulling a tank applicator on Route 1 between Hoopeston and Rossville when a semi hit her from behind.

Gernand was taken to Carle Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, then airlifted to the burn center.

The truck driver, Roger L. Baldwin, 39, and his passenger, Maleesa A. Jones, 24, were treated and released from the hospital.

According to reports, Gernand was northbound on Route 1 near Red Top Cemetery. She was trying to turn left onto County Road 3870 North when she was struck by the 1983 Kenworth. The collision caused fires in the vehicles, both of which came to rest on the east side of a concrete bridge.

Both lanes of the highway were blocked for hours as Illinois State Police, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department deputies and Hoopeston police responded, along with Hoopeston and Rossville fire departments and emergency medical personnel.

Baldwin was ticketed for improper passing at an intersection and no valid registration.
