

# **Cleanup** continued from other side

Danville, Milford, Wellington, Normal, Bismarck, Watseka, Onarga, Bluegrass, Stockland, Paxton, Loda, Rossville, Urbana, East Lynn and Ridge Farm departments in Illinois and Purdue, Ambia and Boswell departments from Indiana, in fighting the fire that was reported at 5:20 a.m. Wednesday.

Several residents reported waking up Wednesday and noting the dark sky, thinking Hoopeston was in for a storm. The sound of sirens and a couple whiffs of the outside quickly told a different story.

Many residents were evacuated from their homes, both as a precaution to the danger of the fire and from deteriorated air quality.

Residents evacuated from the north and east of the fire were able to return home Wednesday night and those west of the scene were allowed to return Thursday morning.

Employees reported that the blaze started with a spark in near loading docks and spread quickly through the three-block long building.

Aerial trucks from several departments fought the blaze from above, while others fired copious amounts of water from ground level in an effort to keep it from spreading to nearby homes.

Fire officials expressed early concern about a 2,000 lb. propane tank which had recently been filled, but were able to keep the fire away from the tank.

Train traffic was halted shortly after the fire was reported, resuming at about 6 a.m. Thursday, with early trains going through the city at a snail's pace.

Lance Smith, R&J general manager, said Wednesday that the company planned to resume business as quickly

as possible but may not be possible, based on action taken by the Illinois EPA.

Illinois EPA is seeking an immediate injunctive court order halting operations at J&R.

In a press release Wednesday, the EPA said J&R accumulated approximately 200,000 Passenger Tire Equivalents, used/waste tires on-site (an estimated 2,500 tons) in either whole or shredded tires.

In addition to smoke, IEPA is concerned with runoff issues from the water used to fight the fire that may allow contaminants from the fire to neighboring properties or into sewage/storm water systems.

The injunction seeks to force the owners to:

- Stop all activities on-site, including but not limited to continued storage of used or waste tires on-site.
- Assess damage done by the fire.
