At least one person in a van monitored Hoopeston's air quality Tuesday in the wake of last week's fire at J&R Tire Recycling.

The man drove around Hoopeston, pulling to the side of the street every few feet, left arm extended out the van window to take air readings with a handheld monitor. A laptop in the passenger seat kept track of the readings.

Meanwhile, behind the Ameren substation on Route 9, workers monitored runoff collected from the water - with estimates as high as 3 million gallons - used to fight the fire.

In a third wave of monitoring, EPA workers were expected in Hoopeston Tuesday to collect debris from the fire that wafted into residents' yards.
