Hoopeston Area to receive matching grant for pipe repairs

A state matching grant will help Hoopeston Area pay for repairs to Maple School water pipes.

At Thursday evening's Hoopeston Area school board meeting, Mark Eighner, director of transportation/building and grounds, told the board the district will receive the grant, which will pay half of the estimated \$49,000 project.

Leaks were found in the pipes, located under the building, after asbestos was removed from the area, said Supt. Hank Hornbeck.

In other business, Eighner presented the end-of-the-year financial report. "We had a good year," he said.

The education fund showed a \$200,000 shortfall on June 30, but a \$175,000 state aid payment, expected in June, arrived July 3.

Hornbeck said he thinks the payment was delayed as part of "a shell game the state plays to make their books look better at the end of the year."

Taking into consideration increased salaries from contract negotiations and the state pro-rating funds to the district, "Overall, financially, our district is in pretty good shape," he told the board.

Administrators talked about the 2013-14 year. Hornbeck said registration will be held August 6,7, and 8, with the first student attendance day on August 19. School will be dismissed at 2:05/2:20 that day.

Previous years had early dismissal until after Labor Day but that will not happen this year because of changes in the law, Hornbeck said. Regular dismissal will be in force unless there is excessive heat, he said.

Related to the new year, new immunizations are required this year and the district is working with Carle Hoopeston Regional Health Center to offer those to students, Hornbeck said. The shots will also be available from local doctors and Vermilion County Health Department.

The district is also offering hepatitis B shots for staff.

In other business, the board:


- Approved Jim Klaber and Tom Benjamin as soccer volunteers and Stephanie Nogle as Honeywell office volunteer for the 2013-13 year.
- Approved medical leave for Teryl Silver from August 15 to April 4, 2014, and Silver's retirement, effective April 14, 2014.
- Approved Maple, Honeywell, John Greer and middle school student policy manuals.
- Approved Prairie Farms, Aunt Milly's and Illini FS for dairy, bread and fuel for the year.
