FMC memories featured at HPL

Hoopeston Public Library will offer local residents the opportunity to reminisce and share memories of one of the community's largest former employers when it presents "Remembering FMC" at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 30 in the lower level meeting room.

The informal evening will feature an assortment of old photos, scrapbooks, videos and other memorabilia from the library archives that span the history of FMC and the Sprague-Sells Company. No formal program is planned; patrons may simply drop in, view the displays and videos and visit with friends or former coworkers.

For more than a century, FMC and its predecessor, Sprague-Sells, were major contributors to Hoopeston's economy and the fabric of local life. The devastating fire last month at the site of the former manufacturer has generated renewed interest in the history of the facility and its lasting impact for generations of families and the community.
