Super Bowl champ McKinnon to raise funds for Hornets

A former Chicago Bear will take part in a fundraiser for the Hoopeston Hornets.

Dennis McKinnon, #85 for the Bears, will be at a meet and greet from 4-8 p.m. Monday at the Hoopeston Youth Football field on Sixth Ave.

Donations of \$1 minimum will be taken at the gate or people can contact Jeff Compton about donations at (217) 772-1398.

At the field, residents may have pictures taken with the 1985 Super Bowl star. There will also be a dunk tank, throwing contest and obstacle course. The league's concessions stand will be open for the event.

McKinnon, a wide receiver, attended Florida State University. He was signed by the Bears in 1983 as an

undrafted free agent. In eight seasons with the Bears, he caught 194 passes for 3,012 yards and 22 touchdowns.

During the Bears champion season, McKinnon caught 31 passes for 555 yards and seven TDs. McKinnon and his teammates went to Super Bowl XX, where the Bears topped the New England Patriots, 46-10.

His best season was in 1988, when he caught 45 passes for 704 yards and three touchdowns. He returned 40 punts for 405 yards and a franchise record two touchdowns, which was not broken until 2006.

Following his appearance for Midget Football, McKinnon will be at BJ's Pump for dinner. He is also expected to sign autographs there, as well as have a signed Bears jersey auctioned off.
