Officials may take of Vermilion Iron, Essex, seek tax hike

Hoopeston aldermen are considering taking ownership of the former Vermilion Iron and Essex properties.

The city council assembled Tuesday night but could not meet officially because agendas for the meeting were not sent until Monday afternoon, violating the Illinois Open Meetings Act, which states agendas must be posted 48 hours before a meeting.

On the agenda for Tuesday was discussion and possible action on accepting the Vermilion Iron property on North Sixth Ave.

Representatives of Hoopeston Economic Development Committee (HEDC), Vermilion County Health Department, Vermilion Advantage, and Foth Infrastructure and Environment urged the council to get the property so it can be cleaned up more quickly.

The corporation which most recently owned Vermilion Iron, Packard Engineering, has disbanded, said Doug Toole, Vermilion County Health Department's

director of environmental health. City ownership of the property would make it easier for the health department to do a Phase 2 environmental study of possible contaminants, and possibly cleanup, of the site.

Vermilion Iron continued from other side

"The fastest solution - the easies for us certainly - is for you to say you want to take control of that property," he said.

Linda Bolton, of Vermilion Advantage, said she and Toole are "very committed to Vermilion Ironworks." Bolton called Vermilion Iron "probably one of the nastier sites" in the county.

Bill Nicholls, of the HEDC, said "blight taking over our town is like a cancer." Saying city government must provide for things like fire and police protection, he wondered whether, if officials do not take care of the town, "who's going to come here?"

Alderman Randy Carter said Hoopeston continues to deteriorate "and we continue to turn our heads the other way." He suggested an increase in the city sales tax of one half of one percent, half of which would be used for remediation of residential properties and the other half for commercial property remediation.

Mayor Bill Crusinberry said the increase, which would come on the heels of increased water rates, would amount to 25 cents on a \$50 purchase.

Alderman Bill Goodwine said the cleanup cost of a foundry could be "a couple million dollars" and wondered whether cleaning up after others is the responsibility of government.

The issue will be discussed at a special meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 13. The meeting will also include items that could not be acted on Tuesday.
