Hoopeston Ambulance to become part of Arrow group

Hoopeston Ambulance Service is becoming part of Champaign-based Arrow Ambulance.

Harry Brockus, Carle Hoopeston Regional Health Center CEO, and Larry Sapp, Carle Arrow Ambulance director, spoke at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting about the change.

Hoopeston Ambulance Service and Arrow have had a management agreement for about a hear and half, Brockus said, adding the local board approved the change.

Under Arrow, Hoopeston will have improved ambulance coverage, as Arrow ambulances from other locations will be able to cover Hoopeston when needed.

Brockus said the number of ambulance calls has increased significantly, especially to neighboring communities with volunteer services which are "struggling to maintain their core staff."

Sapp said local ambulances have been on more calls than anticipated. Those calls include taking patients to Carle Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital; intercepts with ambulances from other towns, which allow local paramedics to board the other ambulances to provide advanced treatment to patients; and transfers to hospitals in other places, such as Chicago, Indianapolis and St. Louis.

Of Hoopeston Ambulance's current 18-member staff, 11 are paramedics and another three are taking paramedic classes, Brockus said.

Brockus also announced that the service will donate an old ambulance to Hoopeston Emergency Management Agency and that a separate ambulance had already been given to Hoopeston Fire Department for training purposes.

Hoopeston's volunteer ambulance service was established by ordinance in 1984. A tax levy was established to purchase ambulances, which has continued as running

the service was first transferred to Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, then the management agreement with Arrow, and now the integration with the larger service.

The local service currently has two Advanced Life Support ambulances and a third unit used as backup, Brockus said.

In unrelated discussion, a civic improvement committee meeting prior to Tuesday's council meeting resulted in a recommendation to increase the number of liquor licenses available in Hoopeston.

Currently there are five Class A licenses, two each of AA and B and three AAA. The committee is recommending increases to five AA and three B licenses, plus the creation of 3 BB licenses, which would cover beer and wine only at businesses such as pizza parlors.

The council is expected to vote on the matter at its September 3 meeting.

In other business, the council:

- Heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand that the pool closed August 14. At last week's special meeting, resident Darlene Medler said high school lifeguards had agreed to work past the date for adult swim hours but Ankenbrand said that when asked, the students declined to work past the closing date.
- Heard from Kelly Ferrell about a planned skate park fundraiser to be held at McFerren Park. The event is expected to include face painting, scavenger hunt and other activities for younger children during the day and a dance in the evening for others.
- Heard from resident Randy Shields who asked what, if anything, is going on with the Lorraine Theatre. Mayor Bill Crusinberry said a local group is seeking legal advice about forming a nonprofit corporation and working to get the theater from MainSource Bank. The theater has developed an issue with mold, he said.
