Forget your homework assignment? There's an app for that

Two Hoopeston Area High School teachers are piloting a program that reminds students of their homework assignments.

English teacher Ashley Gondzur and science teacher Adam Elliott have been testing Remind 101, a texting program.

Elliott said the program allows teachers to communicate with students and parents via text or email in a totally secure

Remind 101 communicates one way - from teacher to students and parents - but parents and students may not respond, Gondzur said.

to send messages specific to that class. Also, while teachers use their cell phones, Remind 101 creates a unique phone number that shows up in the text messages, not the teacher's actual cell number.

Student response has been "unanimously positive," Elliott said. Of his 31 biology students, 15 students and six parents have signed up. Only nine of 79 general science freshmen have signed up.

Both teachers sought feedback from students. One area where students commented was in the timing of the messages. Elliott sent his messages out in late afternoon, while Gondzur was doing hers later in the

Students liked the earlier messages better because if they had forgotten a book, they could return to school and hopefully enter while the building was still open for extracurricular activities, or could borrow one from a friend and still get their assignment done.

One reason Remind 101 was piloted is because the district technology committee found not everyone has a computer but nearly everyone has a phone capable of texting, Elliott said. "It's a really handy tool
