Along with residents, some local businesses will welcome trick-or-treaters during the specified hours, including Anderson Funeral Home, Autumn Fields, Country Terrace and Heritage Health Nursing Home.

Trick-or-treaters are urged to follow safety tips to make their evening more enjoyable. These include:

- Trick-or-treat only at homes with porch lights lit.
- Go only during designated hours.
- Make sure costumes, including masks, fit properly to allow children to move safely. If possible, use face paints instead of masks. Flat shoes will make walking easier and safer for children.
- Don't take shortcuts. Walk on designated walkways.
- Travel in groups. Parents or older children should supervise younger tikes as they trick-or-treat.
- Go to homes of people you know.

• Inspect treats before eating. Discard any that look like they may have been tampered with.
