

## HA to start new high school intervention program Tuesday

A new intervention program is being offered to Hoopeston Area High School this school year.

After months of research and planning, Suzi Root, district Response to Intervention (RtI) coordinator and administrators are announcing the "After School Assistance Program" (ASAP)

High school teachers will supervise the program and monitor students' progress. Several National Honor Society students will assist each session through peer tutoring.

ASAP will begin Tuesday, Nov. 19, and is aimed at assisting under-resourced learners with academics. The program will be available immediately after school on Tuesday, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 3:25-4:15 in the high school library and will be available to all students.

However, the program is mandatory for any in-season athlete failing one or more classes as a violation of the "No Pass, No Play" policy. The program attempts to reduce the number of ineligible student athletes and to provide them with the resources necessary for success on and off the court.

Each Monday at noon, the athletic director will check eligibility. Student athletes on the report as failing one or more classes will be notified to appear all three days at ASAP, along with their work.

Notices from the athletic director will be sent home with affected student athletes; those notices must be signed by the parent/guardian and returned by students to the dean of students by 8:20 a.m. Tuesday morning.

Students will report to the school library at 3:25 until 4:15 Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday each week and will not attend practice until after 4:15 with a pass from ASAP teachers. Student athletes will be excused from practice, but may need to make up conditioning they may have missed.

Once student athletes are no longer failing, they will be dismissed from mandatory ASAP attendance.

This program is not designed to be a punishment; rather it is designed as a safety net to catch student athletes before they become ineligible and to hold them accountable for their effort towards academic success.

ASAP goals include:

- •Building relationships for encouragement and support for school attendance and a reduction in apathy.
- •Encouraging students to be positive about school and learning
- •Providing assistance with study skills and organization or homework completion
- Reducing discipline and attendance referrals
- •Increasing graduation rates
- $\bullet \mbox{Enhancing}$  athletic programs and extracurricular participation
