Mayor disputes claim he declined offer to accept tire site

Contrary to published reports, Hoopeston officials did not turn down an offer to take ownership of the former J&R used tire facility.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Mayor Bill Crusinberry said J&R owner Rodney Roger's assertion in the November 12 News-Gazette that he offered the property and Crusinberry declined was a "half truth."

Rogers was quoted as saying most of the cleanup at facility, the site of a June 19 tire fire, is complete and that cleanup was paid for with steel salvaged from the site, with Rogers and his wife, Janie, paying the rest of the cost. Since the city turned down their offer, the couple has plans to develop the site, according to the article.

Crusinberry agreed that Rogers did call about giving the property to the city. Crusinberry said he told Rogers he could not make the decision on his own and wanted to check with Environmental Protection Agency officials about possible contamination at the site.

"I never declined the property," Crusinberry said. "That's a false statement. I thought the property is not ready to be transferred to anybody."

There are a few things that still need to be cleaned at the site, including a concrete pad. Crusinberry said he

was told the pad would be cleaned but that it has not yet been cleaned. Also, a retention pond and sewers must also be deemed clean but that will probably not happen until next spring or summer. Soil borings are also supposed to be done to determine any ground contamina-

As for Rogers' plans to develop the property, Crusinberry said he doubted any financial institution would lend money for development until Rogers has a No Further Remediation (NFR) letter from the EPA. Such a letter would be the environmental agency's stamp of approval that the property was cleaned and was not a health hazard from the fire.

Rogers recently opened a new used tire business in part of the former General Motors foundry in Tilton.

In unrelated business, the council:

• Approved new fees for animals running loose that are picked up by the humane officer.

Intake fees were set at \$35 for animals from Hoopeston residents and \$50 for pets owned by others.

Those who want to bail their pets out will pay an intake fee of \$20 for dogs and \$10 for cats, plus \$9 for each day the pet was a guest at the city shelter.

Fees must be paid before the pet is released to the owner. Money will go to fund the city's new shelter, in the former veterinarian office at 901 W. Main, said Alderman Brandon Hamilton.

- Approved giving \$4,000 to Allen Accounting from the city's facade program. Alderman Larry Baughn said the façade committee unanimously agreed to the award.
- Heard from Crusinberry, who praised Hoopeston emergency management volunteers and the communications department for their work in Sunday's storms and resulting power outages.
- Saw a presentation from Curt Ellis on the city's new website, www.cityofhoopeston.com.
