Board discontinues middle school wrestling so club can form

Hoopeston Area Middle School will no longer have a wrestling program but youngsters that age will not be without a grappling program.

At Thursday's meeting, Hoopeston Area School Board approved discontinuing the wrestling program. Instead, a wrestling club will be formed which, head coach Logan Patton said will be better for all the students.

The Illinois Kids Wrestling Federationsanctioned club will still practice at Hoopeston Area High School, Patton said.

There are currently 30 youngsters in the program, from Hoopeston, Rossville and Milford. Currently, Patton can discipline Hoopeston Area students for grade infractions but not the other students. With the club, Patton can make sure all wrestlers keep their grades up.

The club will use IKWF guidelines and will have a board of directors. The school will pay the coach's salary until the end of the year.

In unrelated business, the board heard from transportation director Mark Eighner that the district has saved about \$9,000 in fuel costs with the two new propane buses. In January, Eighner will turn in mileage information to the state to receive a 50 cent-per gallon rebate on fuel costs. Additionally, the district got a \$50,000 grant to purchase alternative fuel buses and will get a \$4,000 state rebate. In other business, the board:
