Fishing club seeks new members



I write to congratulate the fifth grade students of John Greer Elementary who just completed their semester of DARE studies. I was asked to attend their DARE graduation this week, and to give a short speech that would hopefully encourage them. I have done such speeches for the Sheriff's DARE program many times in the past, but not recently.

My husband teaches fifth grade here in Danville so I get a fairly regular update about the challenges facing students, teachers and administrators alike in the world of education today. I certainly recognized in accepting the invitation that I would have to keep the speech short and on point; I just hoped the students would pay a little attention, since the attention span of a 10-year old can be very short.

What a great experience this was! This group of students sat patiently in the hallway waiting to march in, which they did on cue and sat in their chairs. They paid better attention than likely most adults would have and listened to what Deputy Miller said and even to what I said. At no time did any of the teachers have to walk over to any of the students to get them to behave. When it was time for the ceremony in which they receive their certificates, they marched exactly as they had been told. And when they came up to shake hands with Assistant Regional Superintendent Mark Janesky and myself, they did it with polish that again, one might not expect from some adults. They shook hands, looked us in the eye and responded to our "congratulations" with "thank you."

As adults and community members, we way too often focus on the negatives and the difficult challenges of education in our world today. We also too often forget that these young people are our future. They go to school each day to learn from their teachers and to grow. And despite all the times they do not quite reach up to our expectations, we all need to take more time to encourage them and to celebrate them.

So let me congratulate the fifth grade teachers and Principal Daniel Walder at John Greer Elementary school for the hard work they put in every single day;
