## City council to consider mirroring ordinance with statute

Hoopeston officials may create an ordinance mirroring a state law about carbon monoxide detectors.

Alderman Larry Baughn, chairman of the civic improvement committee, brought up changing the smoke and fire detector ordinance to include carbon monoxide detectors at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Passed in 2006 and effective January 1, 2007, the state law requires carbon monoxide detectors to be installed within 15 feet of all rooms used for sleeping in private homes, apartment buildings and hotels/ motels.



The law applies to those structures where fossil fuels are used to heat, cook, heat water or are connected to an enclosed garage.

However, Alderman Randy Carter moved to table the change since copies of the change were not available to all council members prior to the meeting. In other business, the council:

• Approved increasing the city's contribution to Keep Vermilion County Beautiful from \$100 per year to \$250 annually. KVCB has awarded several beautification grants to Hoopeston entities, said Mayor Bill Crusinberry.

• Heard from Alderman Bill Goodwine that the city will seek bids for garbage collection. The current contract expires in March. The current contract is for more than \$300,000, he said.

• Heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand, parks committee chairman, who called a committee meeting for 3:30 p.m. Friday at city hall. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the splash pad project.

• Heard from engineer Mike Streff of Foth Infrastructure and Environment, that the first pay request has been requested by Leander Construction for the water storage project in the amount of \$284,936.51.
