Local legislators respond to Quinn's state of state speech

Illinois is better than it was five years ago, Gov. Pat Quinn said in his state of the state speech January 29, but not as good as it's going to be.

Quinn outlined the difficulties he inherited, including corruption, a pension crisis and fiscal issues, detailing what he did to fix them and laying out a five-year plan focusing on job creation and increased spending on education, as well as raising the state's minimum wage.

To create more jobs, Quinn said he would add a small-business advocate to his staff and would slash a fee to start a limited liability business. He also wants to focus on early education and prenatal care, double the number of needs-based monetary scholarships for college students, invest in a new center for medical technology startups in Chicago and double the earned income tax credit.

Quinn did not address several issues, including where the money to increase education funding would come from; the state's ongoing pension problems; and the temporary income tax hike that is set to expire. Those issues are expected to be topics in Quinn's budget address on February 19.

Both state Sen. Jason Barickman (R-Bloomington) and state Rep. Josh Harms (R-Watseka), weighed in on Quinn's speech.

"While Governor Quinn and I both have a vision for Illinois filled with more good-paying jobs, lower debt, and quality schools, we differ greatly on our paths to get our state there," Barickman said.

"Since becoming Governor, Pat Quinn has increased taxes by 67% on every family in Illinois, he has increased spending and exploded our backlog of unpaid bills. What we heard today in his address was more of the same: he wants to tax more, borrow more, and spend more.

I believe Illinois should be a place in which job crea-

tors have an easier time creating new, good paying jobs that raise up the middle class. We should have a low tax base that provides for more jobs that help fund an effective, efficient government, and better schools.

Pat Quinn should stop relying on more taxes and more spending and start trying to make Illinois a place that can grow."

Harms said the Governor's refusal to lead has driven Illinois into the ditch. "A recent Moody's analysis has ranked Illinois as dead last in the country for job creation and we have the second largest outward migration out of any state; citizens are leaving at an alarming rate," Harms said.

"We must start to build a stable tax environment and eliminate the constant threat of increased taxes. Illinois is the transportation hub of the nation; we have great infrastructure, and a workforce that is second to none; the only thing holding Illinois back is bad government. The people of Illinois want jobs, good paying jobs, not just more rhetoric out of the governor."

Quinn, who is seeking reelection this year, also drew fire from Democratic challenger Tio Hardiman, and Republican hopefuls Bill Brady, Kirk Dillard, Bruce Rauner and Dan Rutherford
