Fire quickly spreads from garage to apartment building

"What are we going to do now?"

An unidentified tenant of an apartment building in at 715 S. Fifth St., asked that of a second tenant as they watched firemen working feverishly to extinguish a blaze that started in a garage, then quickly spread to the apartment house.

According to unconfirmed reports, a woman and her children were also tenants in the two-story structure.

No injuries were reported in the fire, which was reported at 1 p.m. Thursday. Called in as a garage fire, the blaze quickly spread to the apartment building.

Hoopeston Fire Chief Cliff Crabtree requested men and equipment from Rossville, Wellington, Rankin and Milford fire departments.

Firemen were on the scene for about four hours, working to keep the fire from spreading to neighboring structures.

The Illinois Fire Marshal's office was called to investigate the cause of the fire.

The Red Cross provided housing for the tenants on Thursday night, giving them time to make more permanent arrangements.

A call went out over social media to collect items to be given to the displaced tenants.
