Dodge ball tournament to help fund marching band trip

Hoopeston Area Music Boosters is hosting a dodge ball tournament to help the Marching Cornjerkers fund a trip to the Chick-fil-A Bowl in Atlanta.

The tournament will begin at 10 a.m. May 31 at the high school and is open to anyone in sixth grade or older. Each six-person team has the option of having two additional players as alternates. Teams will be divided into classes based on age.

Each team must be dressed uniformly, with coordinating colors or designs and all team members must sign an insurance waiver. Each team must have a dedicated captain to receive email correspondence and be respon-

sible for team affairs.

Cost for the tournament is \$30 per team for entries postmarked by May 26. After that date, the fee is \$35. Payment may be in cash or check made out to Hoopeston Area Music Boosters. Checks for preregistration may be mailed to the Music Boosters, 615 E. Orange St., Hoopeston IL 60942.

Teams may register at the door the day of the tournament. All teams must be registered by 9:45 a.m.

Hoopeston Public Library displays a tribute to migrant

Hoopeston Public Library Reading Room features vintage articles on the migrant contribution to the Hoopeston area.

For example, in Andre Fonaine's Nation Business (1951) magazine, it states that "Hoopeston has done the best job of any town in the country." Other articles point out the relationship of the canning companies and the migrant workers, many of whom were natives of Texas.

Rare, among the vintage collection, are the 1947-52 Hoopeston news clippings about migrant families. The photos and stories include priests, fiestas, canning factories, strikes, dances, pet shows, piñata customs, weddings, asparagus field workers and very importantly, opportunities for education.


