Agency accepting applications for LIHEAP cooling program

East Central Illinois Community Action Agency's Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) will implement a Summer Energy Assistance Program. Applications for the program will be taken on an appointment basis at 56 N. Vermilion St, Danville, beginning Monday, July 7, from 7 a.m.–3 p.m. Customers may begin calling (217) 443-2705 on Thursday, July 3, 2014.

LIHEAP Summer Energy Assistance Program is targeted to at-risk households. Benefits can be provided only to income eligible households that can be included in one of the following groups:

Households that contain a member who is elderly (age 60 and above). Required documentation includes driver's license, State ID, or birth certificate.

• Households that contain a member receiving social security disability benefits or with a pending determination case at the Social Security Administration. Required documentation must include a letter of determination from the Social Security Administration or receipt of social security disability benefit statement.
Households that contain children age 5 or under (includes all children not yet 6 years of age). A birth certificate or medical card will be required to prove age.

• Households that contain a member with a medical condition that can be ameliorated by air conditioning, such as asthma, emphysema, coronary disease and terminal illnesses. Required documentation must include a doctor's certification letter dated within the last ninety days, stating that the medical condition would be aggravated by extreme heat.

In addition, customers must bring the following:

• Proof of income for all household members for the past 30 days;



• A copy of their most recent electric bill; and

• Social security cards for all household members.

Because of the shortness of the program, no pending applications will be taken. Customers must bring all documentation with them to their appointments.

Customers are assisted based on the availability of funds and income eligibility. Community Action will specifically serve all households who meet income

guidelines.

Customers who are currently enrolled in the PIPP Program are ineligible for the Summer Cooling Benefits.
