Health department ruling ends salad luncheon

After 22 years of hosting the very popular St. Anthony's Salad Luncheon, the ladies of the church group have reluctantly been forced to cancel this year's luncheon because of the position of the Vermilion County Health Department insisting that all of the donated salads and desserts be prepared on site in the parish hall kitchen. The ladies say that every year, since the inception of the event in the early 1990s, all salads and desserts have been prepared in the ladies' homes and brought to the hall on the day of the luncheon, to be served to some 200 or so customers from Hoopeston and surrounding towns.

The church has always complied with the permit requirements of the health department. In fact, on many previous occasions, health department inspectors have attended the event and found no violations of any kind! However, this year, the health department has insisted on this "no home preparation" provision supposedly due to a part of the statue that is meant to protect the public health.

The ladies say that to try to prepare all these many items, with 30 or 40 women all trying to work at once in the same kitchen, would be total chaos, to say nothing of the lack of sufficient refrigeration space to store all of the made-up items. In addition, many of the ladies who donate these items work for a living and wouldn't have time to gather all their ingredients and travel to the hall to work in an unfamiliar kitchen at a time that may not be convenient for their busy schedules.

So, sorry to say, the event must be cancelled. It is too bad that all of the charitable organizations helped in the past from the proceeds of the salad luncheon will have to find another source of revenue.
