County seeks help in collection of dead birds for WNV levels

Vermilion County Health Department is asking for public assistance with collecting dead birds to test for West Nile Virus.

"Finding out if the virus is present in Vermilion County allows us to alert residents to take precautions when they are outside and make sure their homes are free of places where mosquitoes breed," said Jenny Trimmell, public health administrator.

The health department will accept a limited number of certain types of dead birds, including crows, blue jays, grackles, starlings, sparrows, finches, robins, cardinals, flycatchers, swallows, catbirds, mockingbirds, warblers and wrens, for testing.

Not all birds will be accepted for testing. Larger birds are preferred because they provide more tissue for test-See BIRDS on other side

ing. Birds should not be in a state of decomposition and should not have been attacked by animals.

Dead birds are collected locally, then sent to the state laboratory to determine if they have been bitten by infected mosquitoes. Positive results may mean the virus is present in a community.

A mosquito infected with West Nile virus can spread the disease by biting humans. The virus was first noted in Illinois in summer, 2001. By 2002, the Illinois Department of Public Health reported more than 800 human cases of the virus in Illinois. A single case was reported in Vermilion County in 2006 and two cases in 2013.

According to IDPH, most people are not affected when bitten by a West Nile-infected mosquito, but some people, including those over the age of 50 and who may have chronic health problems, are most at risk from the virus.
