Rossville to host eighth annual Truck and Tractor Pull

Big wheels will be turnin' Friday night for the eight annual Rossville Grand National Truck and Tractor Pull.

The pull, in Christman Park, will begin at 6 p.m. and is expected to be a fast-moving event. With two sleds, vehicles are going up and down the track ever two minutes or so.

The pull will have three classes - National Tractor Pullers Association (NTPA), Illiana Pullers Association (IPA) and local classes - with classifications in each.

NTPA classes include GN Super Stock Diesel, GN light Unlimited Modified Tractors, Light Pro Stock and

Super Farm.

Winners in each NTPA class earn points that count towards a national winner, said Robert Danner, one of the event's organizers.

IPA classes are Pro Stock 4X4, Pro Farm Tractors, N/A Tractors, Farm Stock Tractors and 2.6 Diesel Trucks.

Local classes include 6500# Antiques, 14000# Off The Farm Tractors, Open Diesel Trucks and 19500# Semis.

NTPA will lead off pulling at 6:30 p.m., followed by IPA, Antiques, Off the farm tractors, Open Diesel and
