# Hoopeston departments to accept bids on used vehicles

Hoopeston aldermen met Tuesday night but the regular meeting scheduled for the evening was not held because the meeting's agenda was not made public within the 48 hours required by law.

While no action could be taken, some aldermen announced that vehicles no longer needed will be sold by bid. They include:

A 1986 Chevrolet ambulance, most recently used as the Hoopeston Emergency Management Agency's mobile unit.

A 1999 ambulance donated back to the city by the Carle Hoopeston Regional Health Center that had been

used for public relations purposes.

A 1998 Ford 350 diesel 1 ton flatbed truck with manual transmission and hoist.

Information on the vehicles is available at city hall. Bids for the ambulances will be opened at 10 a.m. September 23. Bids on the flatbed will be opened on September 15 and are expected to be approved at the September 16 council meeting.

# Sullivan dashes HA expectations with 73-0 Jerker rout

Hoopeston Area-Schlarman opened their football season Friday night with big expectations, but the Sullivan squad dashed those expectations with a 73-0 route of the Cornjerkers.

Sullivan jumped out to a big early lead when a lightening delay hit at the 10 minute mark. After what seemed like a long delay, the Cornjerkers came out with their best drive of the night. They drove the ball right down Sullivan only to stall out.

A shortened halftime didn't damper the mood of the student body who was out in big force. It was really nice to see the band, cheerleaders and students getting behind this team and great to hear the excitement coming from them.

Senior running back Coty Coon led the way on the ground with 27 yards on 9 carries. Brock Watson came off the bench after Geno Wagoner had to be moved to the line with 15 hard yards on 8 carries. Sophomore quarterback Gavin Gard, making his first varsity start, completed 6 of his 22 passes for 47 yards.

The leading receiver was Gavin Stines as the two Gav-



ins hooked up 3 times for 27 yards. Gannon Hughes had 2 catches for 15 yards and Brock Watson chipped in with one reception for 5 yards.

Geno Wagoner had to move early from the backfield to the line due to Sullivan's quickness. With Wagoner tearning up with Mason Gard, Kade Ramos, Jacob Varns and Trenton Lanter, the line was able to really open the holes and was the key to the long drive.

Defensively the Cornjerkers started three freshmen, who played really well for their first varsity game. Eliseo Zamora led the team in tackles with 5, followed by Geno Wagoner and Kade Ramos with 4 each. Christian Chandler and his freshman buddy, Alex Riddle, had 3 and 2 tackles each.

The Cornjerkers will be back in action Friday as they travel to Dwight.
