School district details changes in 2015 school board elec-

Hoopeston Area CUSD #11will have three school board seats to be filled at the April 7, 2015 Consolidated Election. Two candidates will be elected from the old Hoopeston School District and one from outside. Candidates who are elected will fill four-year terms expiring in April 2019.

Those seats are currently held by Mark Schaumburg and Chris Small in the old Hoopeston District and Chris Elliott from outside.

Candidates for the office of school board can begin to circulate nominating petitions for signatures beginning September 23. The period for filing nominating papers runs from December 15 through December 22.

Unlike previous years, changes in the state election laws have moved the responsibility of school board elections from the local board secretary. Those duties will


