HA wrestler Ezra Elliott to compete in Iowa for national title

Hoopeston Area wrestler Ezra Elliott will compete in Iowa on October 25-26 for a national title.

He will compete in the Preseason Nationals on the Northern Iowa University campus in Cedar Falls, competing in a 70-plus man bracket with wrestlers from 36 states.

Elliott, in the seventh and eighth grade division at 91 lbs., is among wrestlers who are qualifiers, placers, and champions in their states, respectively.

Since the end of last wrestling season, Elliott and his teammates have been putting their time in on the wrestling mat.

Last season, he and Adam Colunga both placed sixth at the Senior Division at state, which is seventh and eighth grade, along with Abel Colunga placing seventh at the Midget State Championships, which is third and fourth grade.

After state, Elliott, Adam Colunga, Brody Powell and Tyson Coon were selected to wrestle for Team Illinois Bronze, coached by Logan Patton, Hoopeston Area head high school and youth coach. This team dualed national teams from Iowa, Kentucky, New Mexico, Indiana, Texas, Ohio, and Nebraska.

Along with wrestling for Team Illinois, Hoopeston Area wrestlers competed at the Iron Sharpens Iron team camp. The youth team, led by Elliott, along with Powell, Cole Gaddis, Coon, and Colton Hughes, brought home the championship, winning the middle school division.

But these boys weren't satisfied. Elliott, Gaddis, and Coon wrestled that weekend at the Midwest Nationals. All three boys came home with medals as Elliott took second, Gaddis took third, and Coon took fourth.
