Kameron Hoskins puts Hoopeston Area on the board at last football game of the season

Kameron Hoskins wore the crown as Hoopeston Area High School's Homecoming and Friday night, he was the star of the Cornjerkers' final game of the season.

Both Hoopeston Area and challenging team, Milford, wanted Hoskins to score during the Senior Night game as many Milford players co-op with Hoopeston Area for wrestling.

Hoskins' score came at the half. With the Cornjerkers defense stopping Milford on 4th down, Hoskisns lined up in the backfield and took the handoff from Gavin Gard and scampered 70 yards for the only Cornjerker TD in the team's 68-7 loss to the Bearcats.

Nearly the whole Cornjerker offensive line had to be replaced, with Geno Wagoner, Chris Webb, Mason Gard (limited to just kicking) and Adan Colunga all out with shoulder problems, Pedro Linares, offensive tackle/defensive end, with a broken hand, and Brock Watson available for only one half after he gutted it out all week with a shoulder/rib injury. Leading rusher Coty Coon went down with an ankle injury.

Residents are encouraged to bring broken, obsolete or unwanted electronic items to the Bryant Industries facil-ity on November 14 so that they can be recycled.

Bryant Industries will also accept flat-screen or CRT television sets and monitors at the collection for a small fee, but not projection-style sets and wood-framed con-sole TVs.

Residents will be charged \$15 for each monitor or television set they bring to the collection, but will re-ceive \$15 vouchers in exchange, which can be redeemed at the Bryant Industries U-Pull Auto Parts yard at 1346 Warrington in Danville.

Bryant Industries will accept, at no charge, answering machines, calculators, camcorders, cameras, CB radios,


CD players, CD/DVD/floppy drives, cell phones, copy machines, cords and cables, desktop PCs, fax machines, hard drives, keyboards, laptops, mice, microwave ovens, modems, pagers, paper shredders, postage machines, printers, radios, scanners, servers, speakers, tape drives, telephones, two-way radios, typewriters, UPS backups, VCRs, video game systems, word processors and many other household electronics at the collection.

"Many of these items contain precious resources that we must make every attempt to conserve, as well as hazardous substances and toxins that we must make every attempt to prevent from reaching our landfills and incinerators," said Brent Richards, Bryant Industries COO.

"We like having a collection close to America Recy-cles Day, and we appreciate the effort that Bryant Indus-tries is putting into helping us achieve that," said Jenny Trimmell, public health administrator.

This will be the primary America Recycles Day event for Keep Vermilion County Beautiful in 2014.
