Hoopeston voters reject one percent city sales tax

Hoopeston voters on Tuesday defeated a proposal to implement a one percent sales tax in the city, according to unofficial results.

In a low-turnout election, the measure was defeated 591-568.

Voters in Grant 1 and Grant 6 approved the tax but not by a wide enough margin to overcome no votes in precincts 2-5.

The issue generated some local interest, with letters to the editor for and against the tax, and some interest at the state level, as well.

Some residents received a mailer from the Illinois chapter of Americans for Prosperity, a group favoring lower taxes and less government. The state's chapter is based in Naperville and is headed by David From, who did not immediately return phone calls about the mailing.

Local voters bucked statewide trends in Tuesday's election, voting for Republicans Jim Oberweis for U.S. Senator, 853-509, over Dick Durbin; Paul Schimpf for attorney general over incumbent Lisa Madigan, 783-600; and in the statewide advisory question about raising the minimum wage to \$10 per hour, Grant voters gave the measure the down vote, 724 to 690.

In the state race for treasurer, which was still undecided Wednesday afternoon, Grant voters chose Republican Tom Cross over Democrat Mike Frerichs, 799-579.
