Hoopeston Area board approves levy, 'clean' 2014 audit

Finances were a major topic of discussion at Thursday evening's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting.

The board unanimously approved a \$3.1 million tax levy, up from \$2.8 million last year, after a short public hearing on the issue.

Whether HA will actually receive that much will depend on the equalized assessed value (EAV) of the district, which, after dropping from \$66 million to \$61 million a couple years ago, has held steady, said Supt. Hank Hornbeck.

Next year's EAV may give the levy a boost, Horn-

beck said, since area wind farms will be included for the first time. "Maybe we'll have a different story then," Hornbeck said.

In other financial business, Russ Leigh, of Russ Leigh and Associates, presented the district's annual audit, which showed no problems.

Leigh told the board that district funds - including education and building funds - are doing well, while the transportation fund is down due to cuts in state funding.

The education fund suffered a \$94,000 loss but still ended the year with \$5,362,000. The building fund ended the year with \$850,000 and transportation, \$138,000.

While no problems were found in the district's finances, Leigh told the board that the state likes districts to have enough money on hand for six months of expenses, which HA does not have. "You're just a little shy of that," he said, adding many districts find that "hard to do with funding cuts and lowered enrollment. The key is cutting expenses."

In expense cutting, Hoopeston Area shines. The district had expenses of \$10,906,000 in the fiscal year which ended June 30, down from \$10,952,000 last year.

The audit shows HA's spending per pupil is \$10,302, "right in the area the state says," Leigh said.

Suggested changes for next year's finances include increasing the treasurer's bond. Also, Leigh said, the state is pushing for student activity funds that are not actually controlled by students to be put on district books, so officials were encouraged to look at those.

In unrelated business, the board:

- Approved the three-year common calendar with other Vermilion County schools.
- Named Crissy Coffman as the district agent for Illi-




