nonstop. I cannot believe everything we did. We toured Graceland, the Gibson guitar factory, ate and danced at BB Kings, walked Beale Street, took a musical bus ride where the tour guide played songs on a guitar while we toured the houses of the Memphis musicians. "New Orleans was my favorite," said Aaliyah Colunga. The 25 students joined 200 parishioners in church one Sunday morning. We had broken up into twos and threes and sat all over the church rather than a pew by ourselves. We were totally immersed in the culture. The priest was fire and brimstone. After mass it seemed like the entire congregation hugged us. We felt so welcome."

"The free day in New Orleans was great too," said Rylee Martin. We had New Orleans Po Boys for lunch and rode the trolley down St. Charles St. We walked Bourbon Street at night, had dinner in the French Quarter and then went to Preservation Hall for New Orleans jazz."

"Two years ago I talked Bill into going to New York City from our camp in Lancaster, PA.," said Erika Samet. "We stopped in Philadelphia and saw Constitution Hall and the Liberty Bell, had Philadelphia hoagies for lunch, stayed all night at Mary Tselipsis' house (Hoopeston native and daughter of Dave and Julie Christine) in New Jersey. We took the train into New York City, the subway to Ground Zero, walked to China town (where Bill and Chris Umbanhowar bought "real" \$30 Rolex watches), ate Chinese food, and then went to Times Square. We have a few stories to tell from that trip."
