Carbon monoxide detectors manufactured since 2009 have an "end of life signal," a chirping sound different from the beeping tone that indicates the presence of carbon monoxide.

As a rule, if carbon monoxide is detected, an alarm's

horn will sound loudly four beeps, pause, four beeps, pause, until the gas level returns to normal. The power/ alarm light will flash quickly until the gas level returns to normal, at which time it will shine continuously.

When the detector malfunctions, the horn chirps three times per minute and the power/alarm light flashes about once a minute.

If the detector has reached the end of its life, the horn chirps five times each minute and the power/alarm light flashes five times per minute.

Carbon monoxide is an odorless gas that is created through fuel-burning sources, such as cars, fireplaces, wood stoves, kerosene heaters and gas appliances.

Improperly installed gas appliances or fuel burning heating systems in tightly sealed homes can cause a buildup of carbon monoxide that can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning.

Early symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning include headache, dizziness and nausea. Symptoms may progress to include confusion and drowsiness; fast breathing, fast heartbeat or chest pain; vision problems; and seizures. Continued exposure can lead to death.

Anyone with such symptoms should seek fresh air immediately and call 911.
