### Three candidates run to represent Hoopeston's 4th ward

*Editor's note: Three of Hoopeston's four wards have aldermanic contests for the April 7 election. Candidates in contested races were sent questionnaires. Information from those will be used to profile the candidate and their positions on issues. In today's final installment, Ward 4 candidates are featured.*

Hoopeston Ward 4 voters have a choice of an incumbent and two challengers in the April 7 election.

Incumbent Brandon Hamilton, who has served since 2003, is being challenged by Jeramy Dobkins and Russell Hibma.

Hamilton, 41, sees several issues facing the city, including infrastructure, business retention/expansion, community image and housing.

Saying infrastructure issues don't come with quick, easy or cheap fixes, Hamilton said the city has adopted a proactive position on projects in a financially responsible way.

One example of infrastructure upgrades that have improved several areas is the upgraded water main from Main Street to the new nursing home on Route 1. By agreeing to the project, the city got the water main upgraded, helping to facility the building of Heritage Health, and resulted in repaving the majority of West Main. "This was a good project that has brought favorable results," he said.

Officials have an agenda to address the other areas, as well. "While it is quick and easy to jump to a negative attitude, as an alderman, the focus is to maintain a positive environment for growth and development in these areas," he said. "Positives develop positives."

For example, he said, working with Vermilion Advan-

tage brings additional resources to help the city broaden its scope and "keeps us objective to all business opportunities, as well as how the city presents itself. Ultimately, every resident and business owner has a part in this, but when the city maintains a positive environment, good things can happen." He cited Autumn Fields as an example of the city partnering with stakeholders that brought a positive to the community.

Hamilton called the sales tax issue "an opportunity for residents and visitors to further invest in the city," saying if passed, funds will be used in select municipal projects from which all residents will benefit. However, he said he understands why some oppose the idea. "As an alderman, pass or fail, I will support the voice of the residents and continue to move forward in the best interest of the city," he said.

Hamilton has a master's degree in business administration and a bachelor's in marketing. He is employed by ThyssenKrupp Crankshaft Company in Danville.

Dobkins, 28, said keeping youth in Hoopeston is a concern, as are dilapidated buildings, infrastructure and fiscal responsibility.

"We have youth in this community that are presented with little options outside of our public school," Dobkins said. "We have great opportunity in our youth, but without a career to return to, many leave for college only to return as a visitor, not a resident," he said.

He is concerned about "a large scale income-based housing issue that has been allowed to spin out of control, leaving the city with the burden of eradicating dilapidated resi-

dences.”

Additionally, roads, sidewalks, water and sewer systems are in need of great repair.

“We need to tackle as much of this as we can,” he said. “We should be asking ourselves: ‘Can we do some of this ourselves and save money?’ Fiscal responsibility on all fronts has to be a major part of investing in our infrastructure.”

As for the sales tax, Dobkins said he was initially skeptical of it, but since learning what will be exempted from the tax and where the money will be used, he now favors it to improve Hoopeston. Still, Dobkins said, he has reservations and would want a firm commitment from the city that the tax will be followed by stricter enforcement of ordinances regarding dilapidated houses and that funds would be used for “needs” and not “wants.”

“We have to look at our community in reality,” he said. “We have hemorrhaged good jobs and people for the past few decades. Our infrastructure is failing, our community has a relatively high crime rate and we are sticking band-aids on problems that require surgery. This will ultimately come back to haunt our children and
