# Arrow ambulance director gets head start on new contract

A contract between Hoopeston and Arrow Ambulance is set to expire in September, but Arrow director Larry Sapp is getting an early start on a new agreement.

Sapp was at Monday's Hoopeston City Council meeting with an update on the ambulance service and a requests for a new contract and a new ambulance.

The city council, which owns the ambulance service, originally turned over management of the service to Hoopeston Hospital. When the hospital integrated with Carle, the hospital board approved turning ambulance service operations over to Arrow Ambulance.

A one year contract, with an automatic one year renewal, was approved in 2013.

Sapp said two ambulances serve the Hoopeston area 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Under the existing contract, Arrow has spent \$10,000 on ambulance repairs

and has done some remodeling of the kitchen of the ambulance building. A new communications system has been installed in ambulances and new technology added to the service.

Staffing has also changed with "a little bit of turnover there," Sapp said.

Ambulance staff respond to about 160 calls per month, or 5.25 per day, with the busiest month having 190 calls, he said.

The average response time is 4.5 minutes, almost half the state average of eight minutes. The response time to out-of-town calls is 12 minutes, compared to the state average of more than 20 minutes.

Sapp said the service would like to replace a 2006 ambulance that has 220,000 miles on it and failed to

the city's ambulance committee.

While Hoopeston could seek bids on a vehicle, Alderman Brandon Hamilton said Arrow likely gets a better deal, a thought which Sapp confirmed. "We have a little bit of buying power," he said. "We do buy a lot of them."

In unrelated discussion, the council heard from engineer Mike Streff, of Farnsworth Group, about ongoing work on the city's water treatment system.

He said the old ground water storage tank is offline and that a crane removed the aerator from the top of it. The interior had about a foot of rusty sludge that was removed and is drying at the water treatment plant before being taken to the landfill. The tank will be cleaned and painted and the top will either be repaired or a new one installed.

Meanwhile, a second crew is expected to start painting the legs of the water tower, he said.

In other action, the council approved a bid from Flower and Herb Pharmacy for perpetual care urns. Under the bid, 127 urns will be planted with live plants at a cost of \$45.15 each and 63 will be planted with artificial plants at \$65.80 each. The bid total is \$9,879.45, said Alderwoman Nancy Stipp, cemetery committee chairwoman.
