

Last week, I had the pleasure of hosting a Town Hall

meeting on Common Core standards and PARCC testing. Our panel included a variety of stakeholders, including school administrators and students. Our audience was filled with parents, students and teachers.

We heard a wide variety of opinions on Common Core, ranging from staunch opposition on one end to cautious optimism on the other. One area the entire crowd seemed to agree on was the negative impact that PARCC testing has had on our schools, students and teachers.

I stood with 30 other members of the Illinois Senate and House of Representatives last year to vote "no" on the implementation of the PARCC tests, which was simply not ready. I thought then that it would create

too, too much of a burden on our schools. These tests

require the use of computers, which represent expensive upgrades during a time when state education funding has fallen. The other night, many of the administrators noted that it also meant classes losing access to technology

because existing computer labs were being used for testing.

For all of our students, taking the tests means fewer days in the classroom learning. For teachers, this means more of a switch to "teaching to the test" methods, and less of an ability to utilize organic and innovative learning techniques. Everyone involved in education at the local level is left with less input and control, from teachers and administrators to parents.

This is yet another example of how leaders in Chi-

cago and Springfield have dumped major obstacles and unfunded mandates on our already-strained education system. Our students don't need more testing and our schools don't need more bills. We have to stand up for our children's education.

It may be too late to stop PARCC implementation, but we still have time to reform how we fund our schools, and how we create new mandates. Our state's one-size-fits-all approach has clearly failed. We must direct our dollars where they can do the most good, and give our local school districts the flexibility to do what they do best – educating our kids.
