Grant board approves budget; roads to be tough issue

Grant Township trustees managed to hold their April meeting and hold a budget hearing and annual meeting in back-to-back sessions Tuesday.

Township Supervisor Megan Deck said there are "not a lot of changes in the" 2015-16 budget over last year's. "We don't have a lot of money to play with," she said.

A total of \$451,400 will be appropriated in the road and bridge part of the budget, with \$321,500 appropriated for the town part.

Under town, expenses related to compensation, office costs and other fees are expected to total \$193,050. For the general assistance fund, \$94,400 has been appropriated. Other appropriations include \$9,550 for Red Top Cemetery expenses and \$24,500 for town insurance.

On the road and bridge side, allotments include \$119,900; \$65,000 for joint bridge; \$45,000 for building/equipment: \$193,500 for hard road improvement: and \$28,000 for insurance and employer's tax.

During the regular board meeting, Road Commissioner Martin Maul said workers have been busy hauling rock and applying cold patch to fix potholes.

Gary Weinard, former township road commissioner and Vermilion County Board chairman, told the board that in an effort to save money, Illinois is trying to put state roads under county control, while counties are trying to put some of their roads under township jurisdiction. In southern Vermilion County, for example, Sidell Township will take six of 12 miles of roads currently maintained by the county.

With coming financial restraints, Maul "is going to have to make some hard decisions abut what's going to stay township and what's going to go back to gravel," Weinard said.

In other business at the regular meeting, trustees approved transferring funds from what will be First Farm-
