Barickman introduces legislation to mandate ignition device for convicted drunk drivers

It was a busy week at the State Capitol, as we continued to consider bills that have already passed the Illinois House. We also continue to work on new legislation to tackle a wide variety of issues. One example I would like to share with you is a bill that I hope could reduce drunk driving on our roads.

Senate Bill 627 was inspired by the work of the Secretary of State Traffic Advisory Council, a legislative body that I am proud to be a member of. The bill would require an ignition interlock device to be installed on the cars of any individual who has had more than one DUI, or was convicted of a DUI in an accident that caused great bodily harm or death.

If you're not familiar with ignition interlock devices, they are systems installed in cars which require the driver to provide a breath sample before a car will start. Drivers are also required to provide a



breath sample at various points while driving. The technology is similar to the breathalyzers used by police to test suspected drunk drivers.

The intent of this legislation is simple, to prevent repeat drunk drivers. People make mistakes, sometimes leading to DUI's, and that is why we have a process for drivers to earn their licenses back. But if they don't learn their lesson, and they continue to endanger our roads with the dangerous decision to drive while drunk, then we have to take steps to keep them off of our roads.
