# First big storm of the season brings flooding, high winds


The Hoopeston area was spared much of a large storm that brought wind damage and flooding north and south of the city late Sunday afternoon and through the overnight hours.

Watches and warnings for severe thunderstorms, flooding and tornadoes came and went as heavy rain deluged the area. Vermilion County is still under a flood

advisory until early tomorrow for the Vermilion River at Danville.

Hoopeston residents reported varying amounts, from 2.5 to 4 inches. The downpour flooded city streets, along with yards in low-lying areas. Some gardens also had standing water in them on Monday morning.

Heavy rains left residual flooding Monday morning at Third St. and McCracken. Other areas in Hoopeston had flooded yards and some flooded gardens were also seen around town.

## **Storm** continued from other side

Rain amounts varied throughout the county. Measuring stations at Henning, Danville and Westville reported 4.02", 3.56", and 2,88", respectively.

Winds, which were predicted to reach as high as 60 m.p.h., were significantly weaker than that in the city, causing damage mostly to small branches around town.

Meanwhile, in Iroquois County, several road commis-

sioners reported flooding on county roads.

The same was true in Vermilion County, as flooding and downed trees closed some roads. In Danville, a building collapsed during the storm but officials have not yet said whether the storm was the cause.

No injuries were reported locally as a result of the storms.

This expo will showcase the latest cover crop application methods and seed vendors, as well as an aerial demonstration. There will be a chance to see and talk to companies about their equipment and application methods. vice, Schertz Aerial, LaCrosse Seeds, Zumwalt Aviation LLC, and Saddle Butte AG.

A local farmer panel will be available to answer questions and discuss their experiences. Special guest Russ Higgins, U of I Crop System Educator, will be presenting on cover crops and weed control.

A portable nitrate sensor will be on hand to test water samples of attendees. This equipment has the ability to measure both nitrates and ammonium in samples.

Those interested in what the nitrate levels are in their farm water - whether from a stream, ditch or tile outlet on their property - may bring a water sample on June 19.

The sample should be at least 8 ounces (a quart glass canning jar works great), and taken within 48 hours of the event.
