Local men who died in Vietnam were remembered by loved ones and strangers over the weekend when The Wall That Heals made an appearance in Watseka. Left, Dennis Wayne Allen, of Milford, a 20-year-old sailor, is remembered with flags and flowers at the wall. He died July 10, 1968. Below, PFC Joseph Allen Kelnhofer, 21, who served as a light truck driver for the Army, was killed January 25, 1968. Bottom right, Cpl. William Elliott Gooden, a Marine, was 20 when he died on June 12, 1969. Other area men who gave their lives for their country include LCPL David Lynn Judy, of Potomac; Maj. Ronald Reuel Rexroad, of Rankin; PFC Rolland Leon Durflinger and CPL Charles Michael Evans, of Watseka; and PO3 Glen Eugene Howard, of Woodland. The Wall That Heals includes a 250-foot replica of the Vietnam Memorial and a mobile education center with information cases, memorabilia and a map and chronological overview of Vietnam. Hoopeston Public Library to offer Resume Support Days

The first step to getting a good job is creating an effective resume. Hoopeston Public Library wants to help area residents who may need some help two free Resume Support Days.

From 2-5 p.m. Wednesday, June 17, and Wednesday, June 24, local adults can visit the library and experienced staff will assist them in using library computers to prepare a resume. Participants will receive a free copy of their resume, and will have the opportunity to print additional copies at a nominal cost. Participants can also save a copy of their resume to take home, if they provide their own flash drive.

Those interested in creating a resume should be prepared with the following information:

- Name, address, phone number and email address.

- Education history, including names and dates of any high schools and colleges attended; date of GED diploma (if applicable); and details of any specialized training they may have received for previous jobs, or special skills.

- Work history, including dates of employment, summary of job responsibilities and addresses and contact information for previous employers.

- References – the names and contact information for 2-3 people (not relatives or former employers) who can speak about the person's work experience and abilities.

Library staff will also be available during this time to assist individuals in completing online job applications.
