Vermilion County voters to get new voter registration cards as part of bi-annual canvas

Vermilion County voters outside the city limits of Danville will be issued new voter identification cards over the next week. The cards are printed in black and include the voter's name, address and polling place, plus a list of election jurisdictions in which the cardholder is entitled to vote. Voters whose polling places have changed will have the new polling place highlighted on their cards.

New cards are mailed out every two years as part of the Vermilion County Clerk's canvas of registered voters, said County Clerk Cathy Jenkins. Cards are not able to be forwarded. Voters who have moved or changed names, or whose address changed, probably will not receive a new card because it will be returned as undeliverable.

In such cases, a second mailing, including postage paid response card, will be forwarded to the voter's new address, if the person has a forwarded order in effect. This card can be used to provide change of address. Name changes require an update of the person's voter registration.

Voters who do not receive a new card or follow-up mailing should contact the County Clerk's office as soon as possible to prevent any problems their registration.

The bi-annual canvas is the way county voter files are updated, removing voters who have moved or who are deceased, and reminding those with new names or addresses of the need to update them.
