New disease, tar spot, impacting corn confirmed in Illinois

SPRINGFIELD-The Illinois Department of Agriculture announced today that the disease tar spot, which impacts corn, has been confirmed in Illinois.

Plant pathologists at the Purdue University Plant Diagnostic Clinic provided the initial diagnoses of the disease and confirmation was made by the United States Department of Agriculture Animal Plant Health Inspection Service. Findings were confirmed in LaSalle, DeKalb, and Bureau counties.

"We anticipate minimal impact on vields with detection this late in the growing season," said agriculture director Philip Nelson. "However, it is important

for farmers to report any suspected findings to prevent the spread of this disease and provide an accurate picture on statewide impact."

Tar spot was confirmed in Indiana last week, marking the first detection in the United States. Previously, the disease was found in Mexico, Central, and South America.

Corn farmers are urged to look for brownish lesions on leaves, followed by black, spore-producing structures that appear later, giving the leaf a rough or bumpy feel.

The disease is favored by cool temperatures and high relative humidity. Rainfall is not a significant factor in disease progress and severity. The disease is not known to be seed-borne or to infect other species.

Farmers who suspect disease should contact their local University of Illinois Extension office and work with the office to submit samples to the University of Illinois Plant Diagnostic Clinic.
