# Hoopeston historian, author, volunteer, friend dies

I talked to Jean Minick Saturday. She called to insistently invite me to a meeting this week. We talked, laughed and said we'd see each other Wednesday.

We didn't.

Jean died at 8:29 a.m. Tuesday at Carle Foundation Hospital, Urbana.

Jean's death is going to leave a hole in the lives of her family, but also in the fabric of Hoopeston. Nobody else I know had the vast knowledge of Hoopeston that Jean had.

If I needed information on an old building, she had it. If I needed to know

something about elections, she knew it. If I needed to know how someone was related to someone else, she could tell me in more detail that I often cared to know.

Jean loved Hoopeston and she showed that love with action. For as long as I knew her, she was always doing something to help. President of the Hoopeston Historical Society, she, along with Carol Hicks and Nora Gholson, recently completed a pictorial history book of Hoopeston.

She served as an election judge. She was involved

with the former Hoopeston Industrial Corporation, Hoopeston Main Street program and other groups. Just thinking about all the things she did makes me tired.

Jean took care of people. Her husband, Gerald, son, Jeffrey Coss, grand-children Haley Coss, whom she and Gerald raised, Gage Foster, Chance Coss and Dorin Coss, and great-granddaughters, Olivia, Lillian and Jasmine, all benefited from her care, as did a lot of others. She was known to take people to doctor and other appoint-

ments, do things they couldn't do for themselves, give sometimes-unsolicited advice and mostly just listen.

Several years ago, she owned a ceramic shop and taught classes. People still talk about how knowledgeable she was and what a good teacher she was.

Jean opened her heart and her home to others.

She'd been ill for a while, but felt well enough earlier this year to play Bovine the Divine, a heavily-made up fortune teller in "Who's Who in the Cornfield." It was the first library production I'd seen and I'm glad I did because she was a hoot in that role.

Jean was born July 17, 1944, the daughter of Webb and Lucile (Acton) Carlson. They preceded her in death, as did an uncle, Eugene "Poots" Carlson.

She graduated from Hoopeston High School and earned an associate degree in engineering from DACC.

She will be cremated and a memorial service will be held at a later date. Anderson Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.
