Hamilton: city to end 911 backup, keep local dispatching

Changes in technology will change how the Hoopeston Police communications department will respond to calls in the future.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Alderman Brandon Hamilton, police committee chairman, said the committee and representatives of the Vermilion County Emergency Telephone System Board met Monday to discuss the issue.

For decades, Hoopeston has acted as a backup for the county's 911 answering system, along with answering local 911 calls. As cell phone use became more prevalent, those calls automatically went to Danville, including 911 calls made on Hoopeston cell phones. Now, Hamilton said, 85 percent of 911 calls come in on cell phones, leaving only 15 percent from landlines.

Hoopeston's role as a 911 answering point will be discontinued in the future, but a final date has not been determined. "That's where we'll be headed in the near term." Hamilton said.

At its October 6 meeting, the council approved spending about \$41,500 for new hardware and software to complement new dispatching equipment being installed by the county.

Hamilton said the city plans to purchase the equipment, which will allow Hoopeston police to communicate with Vermilion County law enforcement.

In divesting itself of being a 911 backup, Hoopeston will incur some costs that had been paid by the ETSB, but those will be less than remaining as a 911 dispatch center, he said.

In other business, the council:

• Approved a bid from Premier Network Solutions of Danville for a new city website. The \$7,500 bid includes \$5,000 for the design and \$2,500 for an e-commerce package, which will allow for such things as renting park shelters online and integrating the existing or new

water/sewer billing system, said Alderman Alex Houmes, chairman of the website committee.

The motion to accept the bid passed unanimously, but a motion to approve a resolution for the purchase was approved 5-1.

Alderwoman Lourdine Florek voted against the resolution because it was not on the agenda; aldermen Houmes, Bill Goodwine, Brandon Hamilton, Chad Yaden and Randy Carter voted in favor.

• Approved the only bid for winter grave blankets, from Flowers & Herb FARMacy, of rural Hoopeston. Thirtynine blankets will be created at a cost of \$54.75 each, Alderman Yaden, cemetery chairman, said.

The cost is up from last year's cost of \$44.75 per blanket.

- Heard from Houmes, parks committee chairman, that some Christmas decoration bulbs were vandalized, which will result in the park gates being locked at night. Details of the closing will be released later this week, he said.
- Heard from Carter that alley cleanup is done. Street and alley workers will now begin pickup leaves. Carter reminded residents to put leaves in the curb to be vacuumed.
