VC officials outline likely county land bank plan to council

A plan to between Vermilion County and Danville officials to deal with dilapidated properties may be expanded to include other communities.

Mike Marron, Vermilion County Board chairman, along with District 1 representatives Darren Duncan and Todd Johnson, attended Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting to discuss a planned land bank in the county.

The county and Danville have signed an intergovernmental agreement to work on a land bank, which would be a means of addressing blighted properties in the county. Properties could be deeded to or purchased by the land bank and could undergo improvements prior to the properties being resold and placed back on the tax rolls, Marron said.

The planned Vermilion County bank would be only the third in the state. Others are in Cook County and the

south suburban area of Chicago, including Park Forest, Oak Forest and Blue Island. While new to Illinois, land banks have been done in other states, including Ohio, Pennsylvania and Michigan.

Marron said Vermilion County has earmarked \$50,000 and Danville \$30,000 for costs like working with a consultant to get the program going and finding a director, who is expected to be part time at first. The person hired would be responsible for finding funding for the land bank.

Other communities to join the land bank but is expecting no money from them - for now - because "it could be upfront, the entire focus is on the city of Danville," Marron said. "I'm hesitant to ask for an investment (from other communities) and (the communities) not see results."



Duncan called the land bank idea "a unique tool" to deal with blighted properties. The land bank could make money on some properties that are rehabilitated, that could then be used to develop others.

Marron said he would send a copy of the intergovernmental agreement with Danville to Hoopeston officials. The agreement includes an outline of the project's current projected scope and other details.

In unrelated business, the council heard from Dawn Morris, whose home in the 300 block of McCracken was again flooded during holiday rains.

After relating efforts to get drains cleaned and water flowing, Morris asked if the city has plans to help residents whose homes have been damaged by repeated flooding.

Mayor Bill Crusinberry said the city has no mechanism for such relief but that in previous floods, residents received help from USDA grants.

Resident Chad Thomas said Hoopeston received 53.83" of rain last year, up from the average of 39.42".

An engineering company hired to develop a plan for flooding on the city's north side is working on a proposal, Crusinberry said.
