Collection box to help residents dispose of prescription drugs

Hoopeston area residents now have an easy way to get rid of expired, unneeded or unwanted prescriptions.

Last week, police officials unveiled a drug collection box, made possible by a grant from CVS/pharmacy, as part of the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids.



Hoopeston City Hall now has a drop off point for expired or unneeded medications.

The locked red and white container will allow residents to put prescriptions in the box instead of in the garbage or flushing them into the city's sanitary sewer system.

By disposing of prescriptions, police hope to help cut down on drug abuse, which has recently soared among teens. More than 70 percent of teens say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a 2014 partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. They aim to prevent half a million teens from abusing prescription medication by 2017.

"Safety disposing of unused medication is critical to protecting our children and our environment," said Chief Mark Drollinger. He thanked CVS for "their commitment to help residents reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in our community.

The collection unit is one of 1,000 boxes that CVS/ pharmacy and The Medicine Abuse Project, a five-year initiative of the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids, are providing nationwide.

The collection box is available 24 hours a day. Drugs may be dropped off with no questions asked. For more information on the program, residents may call 1 (866) 559-8830 or visit www.cvs.com/safercommunities.
