Police investigating early Monday death of 26-year-old man

The Monday morning death of a Hoopeston man is being investigated by Hoopeston police.

Brock Pennington, 26, was pronounced dead at 3:20 a.m. Monday at his home in the 800 block of East Wyman after police received a call from Mrs. Pennington that her husband was nonresponsive, said Chief Mark Drollinger.

Police respond to all deaths not covered under hospice and investigate each until a cause of death is determined and whether there are criminal circumstances, he said.

An autopsy to determine cause of death was scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Tuesday. Toxicology tests are also being done, but those results could take several weeks, Drollinger said.

Arrangements for Mr. Pennington are pending at Anderson Funeral Home, Hoopeston.
