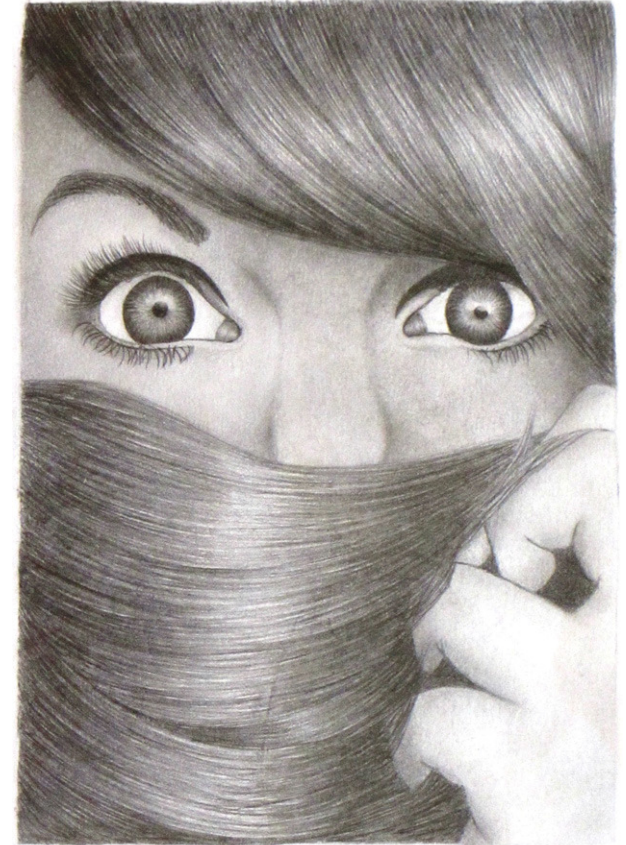

Project health themes are derived from a biennial county-wide survey of Vermilion County high school students.
