Hoopeston Area Expects More! from state stopgap budget

Legislators might have been thinking of Hoopeston Area's motto when it approved a partial budget.

At Thursday evening's school board meeting, Supt. Hank Hornbeck said "public education is a winner again" in the stopgap budget passed by the state last month. Hornbeck expects about \$175,000 more than last year "if they make all the payments."

The money won't make up for what the district did not get in 2015-16 year when the last \$250,000 payment for categoricals was not made.

Categoricals are things funded separately from state aid payments, such as special education and transpor-

In other business, the board:

- Will hold first round interviews with superintendent candidates November 3-5. Second round interviews will be held November 12.
- Approved bids from Illini FS for fuel, Aunt Millie's Bakery for bread products and CloverLeaf Farms for milk products.

Hornbeck said Illini FS was the only bidder of three that submitted a complete bid. Others were from Pence Oil in Watseka and Ken's Oil Service in Forrest.


