Judges receive training in a range of duties, including: greeting voters, providing ballots, assisting voters as needed, overseeing ballot-counting machines, and compiling precinct voter statistics at the end of Election Day.

In Vermilion County, election judges are paid approximately \$120, depending on their assigned duties. Election judges are granted time off from work by law.

Potential judges must be eligible to vote in Illinois; be able to read, write and speak English; and attend a training session provided by local election officials. Most training is approximately four hours long and is held on weekdays, weekends, and evenings to accommodate all schedules.
