





Mandated consolidation will hang up Hoopeston 911

A consolidation of 911 centers will take Hoopeston out of the loop of dispatching emergency services.

Members of the city's finance, police and fire committees met with police, fire and dispatch personnel last week to discuss terms from Vermilion County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) terminating Hoopeston as a backup of the county 911 answering system.

Hoopeston has served as the Vermilion County backup for decades, but as a cost-saving measure, Illinois is consolidating the number of 911 answering points and placing the 911 system under the newlycreated Office of Statewide 911 Administrator within the Illinois State Police.

As of January 1, the administrator is responsible for developing, implementing and overseeing a uniform 911 standard for all areas of the state outside of municipalities with more than 500,000 residents.

Vermilion County and Champaign County's MET-CAD have formed a 911 alliance, which will leave Hoopeston responsible for dispatching only local non-emergency calls, said Mayor Bill Crusinberry at the July 26 meeting.

County officials would like to switch the system over at 10 a.m. August 15, but after reviewing guidelines by which Hoopeston fire, dispatch and police are to operate, city officials want to meet with ETSB representatives to voice concerns over some points. "We need to make sure all the gaps are covered, said Ald. Brandon Hamilton, police committee chairman. For example, one guideline prohibits Hoopeston from dispatching emergency calls that come in on the police department's main number, 283-5196. The guideline states that the Hoopeston dispatcher is to transfer the call to the Vermilion County 911 system, which will then dispatch needed emergency services. Hoopeston 911 coordinator Tom Bookwalter said transferring calls to the county locks up police department phone system for hours, an issue that must be fixed before the guidelines become effective.

Another problem created by the guidelines will be caused when Hoopeston officers responding to an emergency will be expected to communicate on the Vermilion County frequency. "Our portables will not reach Vermilion County," said Sgt. Jim DeWitt, acting Hoopeston Police Department chief.

There are solutions to the problem, such as installing repeaters, but the question then becomes will the county ETSB pay for those changes.

One change that will take some getting used for police is monitoring both the city and county frequencies, DeWitt said. Currently, Hoopeston officers monitor only the Hoopeston frequency and are notified if they need to switch to the county frequency.

While most of the changes will affect emergency responders, one that will be felt by the community is slower response times.

Hoopeston officials had hoped to meet with ETSB representatives this week but a date for such a meeting has not yet been announced.
