Hoopeston Area registration for new year starts Tuesday

Registration for the 2016-17 school year begins today for Hoopeston Area students.

Middle school and high school registration will be held from 8:30 -11 a.m. and 12:30-3:30 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday and 8:30-11 a.m. and 1-6 p.m. Wednesday.

An additional high school registration will be held 8:30-11 a.m. and 12:30-3:30 p.m. Thursday.

Registration for Grades ECSE, K-6 (Maple, Honeywell and John Greer) will be held from 1-6 p.m. Wednesday at Honeywell Elementary.

Special registration assistance will be available to Spanish speaking families on Wednesday.

2016-17 fees

- Early Childhood \$25 book rental
- K-12 \$50 book rental
- MS/HS extra curricular fee \$20 per activity with a

maximum \$40 per student, \$80 per family.

Additional high school fees, due at registration, include:

- Driver education: all freshmen are required to take driver's education. Each freshman will owe \$50 for classroom/behind the wheel instruction.
- Health education: all freshman are required to take health. CPR training will be provided for each student at a cost of \$10 per student.
- Spanish I, II and III will owe \$20 for a workbook.
- Government classes will owe \$12 for weekly magazine.
- Accounting I and II will owe \$39 for a workbook.
- Advanced Placement courses are \$80 each. This fee pays for the AP Exam taken in May.

Illinois drivers to see changes in driver's license procedure

Illinois drivers renewing their licenses should take note of some new processes now in place at the Secretary of State's office.

One key change, mandated by the federal government, is an end to the practice of presenting each driver with a new license on-site when the renewal procedure is completed.

The REAL ID law requires all new drivers' licenses be manufactured in guarded, secured facilities. In Illinois, drivers who successfully renew their licenses at a driver services facility will get their old license back with a hole punched through it, accompanied by an additional 45-day paper slip of successful renewal. The old license will remain temporarily valid through the 45-day period. The driver should carry both the old license and the paper slip.

Meanwhile, information gathered in the driver services facility will be transmitted to a central location where a new, secure license will be printed and stamped.

New licenses will contain features intended to increase the security of the license and further reduce potential counterfeiting. It should be mailed to the driver within 15 days, and once received should be carried and used. The old license with a hole in it will no longer be valid.

The Secretary of State's office is also on course to impose additional security requirements upon first-time applicants for a standard drivers' license, starting in 2017.

First-time applicants will be required to present a
